Services

Child sensory assessment

Cost £795

What you can expect. For children aged 6 to 12. The assessment may include a pre-assessment questionnaire, a home or school visit, naturalistic observation, the Sensory Processing Measure, Second Edition (SPM-2), the PEDI-CAT and the MAIA Youth version, selected according to the referral question. The report explains the child's sensory profile, its effect on everyday participation and supportive strategies.

Child or adolescent neurodevelopmental needs screen

Cost £795

What you can expect. A non-diagnostic screen integrating developmental history, sensory and functional information, discussion with educators where appropriate and selected measures across settings. Measures may explore attention, executive functioning, masking, anxiety, mood, alexithymia and participation. The summary identifies patterns of need, immediate supports and whether further assessment should be considered.

Child or adolescent mental-health review

Cost £850

What you can expect. A focused review of emotional wellbeing and functional impact using clinical interview, contextual information and selected evidence-based measures. It provides a formulation, practical recommendations and guidance on appropriate onward support. It is not a psychiatric diagnosis or crisis service.

School observation with summary

Cost £450

What you can expect. A face-to-face observation of the young person in school, with discussion with educators and information gathered from home and school. The written summary identifies observed strengths, needs and practical support that may be helpful.

School observation with detailed report

Cost £570

What you can expect. A more detailed school-based assessment for situations requiring fuller evidence. It includes observation, consultation with educators, information from home and school, analysis of functional impact and a detailed report with recommendations.

Adolescent and adult sensory assessment

Cost £795

What you can expect. For young people and adults aged 13 and over. This may include a pre-assessment questionnaire, clinical interview, the SPM-2, MAIA-2 and sensory modulation measures, selected according to need. The report provides a clear visual sensory profile, functional interpretation and individualised strategies.

Dyspraxia/DCD assessment (Adult or child)

Cost £995

What you can expect. A comprehensive assessment of motor coordination and its effect on everyday occupations. It may include developmental and medical history, clinical observation, standardised motor assessment, handwriting or sensory measures, functional evidence across settings and collateral information. Evidence is considered against DSM-5-TR and ICD-11 criteria. A motor score alone does not determine diagnosis. Where medical exclusion or additional expertise is needed, multidisciplinary evidence will be sought or a clearly documented working diagnosis provided pending confirmation.

Adult ADHD diagnostic assessment

Cost £995

What you can expect. A comprehensive assessment completed by an HCPC-registered healthcare professional with specialist training and diagnostic-assessment experience. It includes developmental, psychiatric and psychosocial history, symptoms and impairment across settings, collateral information where available, mental-state and risk assessment, and consideration of differential and co-occurring conditions. Evidence is mapped against DSM-5-TR and ICD-11 criteria; diagnosis is never based on rating scales alone. Multidisciplinary or medical input is sought when complexity, uncertainty or risk requires it.

Remote or functional assessment (adult or child)

Cost £750 brief or £895 comprehensive

What you can expect. A needs-led assessment of barriers affecting daily living, education or community participation. It may include interview, observation and selected measures such as WHODAS 2.0, executive-function questionnaires, cognitive screening or the PEDI-CAT. The report can provide supporting functional evidence for applications such as DLA, PIP, Blue Badge or Disabled Students' Allowance, but does not determine entitlement.

Adult neurodivergent occupational profile

Cost £895

What you can expect. A non-diagnostic assessment of how sensory processing, executive functioning, emotional regulation, masking, motor coordination and environmental demands affect everyday life, education or work. Findings are integrated using ICF- and NFOE-informed clinical reasoning to describe strengths, barriers, hidden effort and sustainable adjustments.

Workplace sustainability assessment

Cost £1,250

What you can expect. A detailed assessment of the interaction between the person, their role and the working environment. It explores sensory demands, executive functioning, communication, fatigue, masking, motor or physical needs and barriers to sustainable performance. The report provides prioritised, practical recommendations and suggested reasonable adjustments for discussion with the employer.

Enhanced workplace package

Cost £1,450

What you can expect. The workplace sustainability assessment plus enhanced implementation support. The package is tailored to the referral and may include liaison with the employer, a sensory profile, goal-focused follow-up or email check-ins. The agreed components and timescale are confirmed in writing before work begins.

Neurodiversity-Informed Occupational Coaching

Cost: £100 for an individual 60-minute session. Packages from £700. Employer-funded and Access to Work-funded coaching from £150 per hour.

What you can expect: Individualised coaching for neurodivergent adults and young people aged 16 and over. Sessions may explore executive functioning, routines, emotional and sensory regulation, sustainable productivity, occupational balance, self-advocacy, workplace or education demands and the practical implementation of recommendations.

Coaching packages combine goal-focused sessions with agreed written resources, action planning and between-session support. More comprehensive packages may include sensory or occupational profiling, a detailed strategy report and progress monitoring. Coaching is neurodiversity-affirming and informed by occupational therapy, ACT principles and specialist neurodevelopmental practice. Coaching does not replace mental-health treatment, crisis support or diagnostic assessment. Suitability and the precise package contents are agreed before booking.

Post-diagnostic support and bespoke resources

Cost Price on application

What you can expect. Neurodiversity-affirming support to understand a diagnosis, identify needs and translate recommendations into everyday life. Support may include occupational profiling, sensory work, autism-informed or ADHD-informed strategies, Access to Work preparation, ACT-informed occupational coaching, parent support, workbooks or personalised social narratives. A written proposal is provided once the required level of support is understood.

Speaking and training

Cost From £500

What you can expect. Bespoke seminars, webinars and staff training delivered in person or remotely. Content, preparation, duration, audience size, travel and any delegate resources are agreed in advance and reflected in the quotation.

Clinical supervision

Cost From £70

What you can expect. Remote occupational therapy supervision aligned with HCPC and RCOT expectations. Sessions provide reflective space to explore clinical reasoning, professional development, boundaries, risk and complex practice.

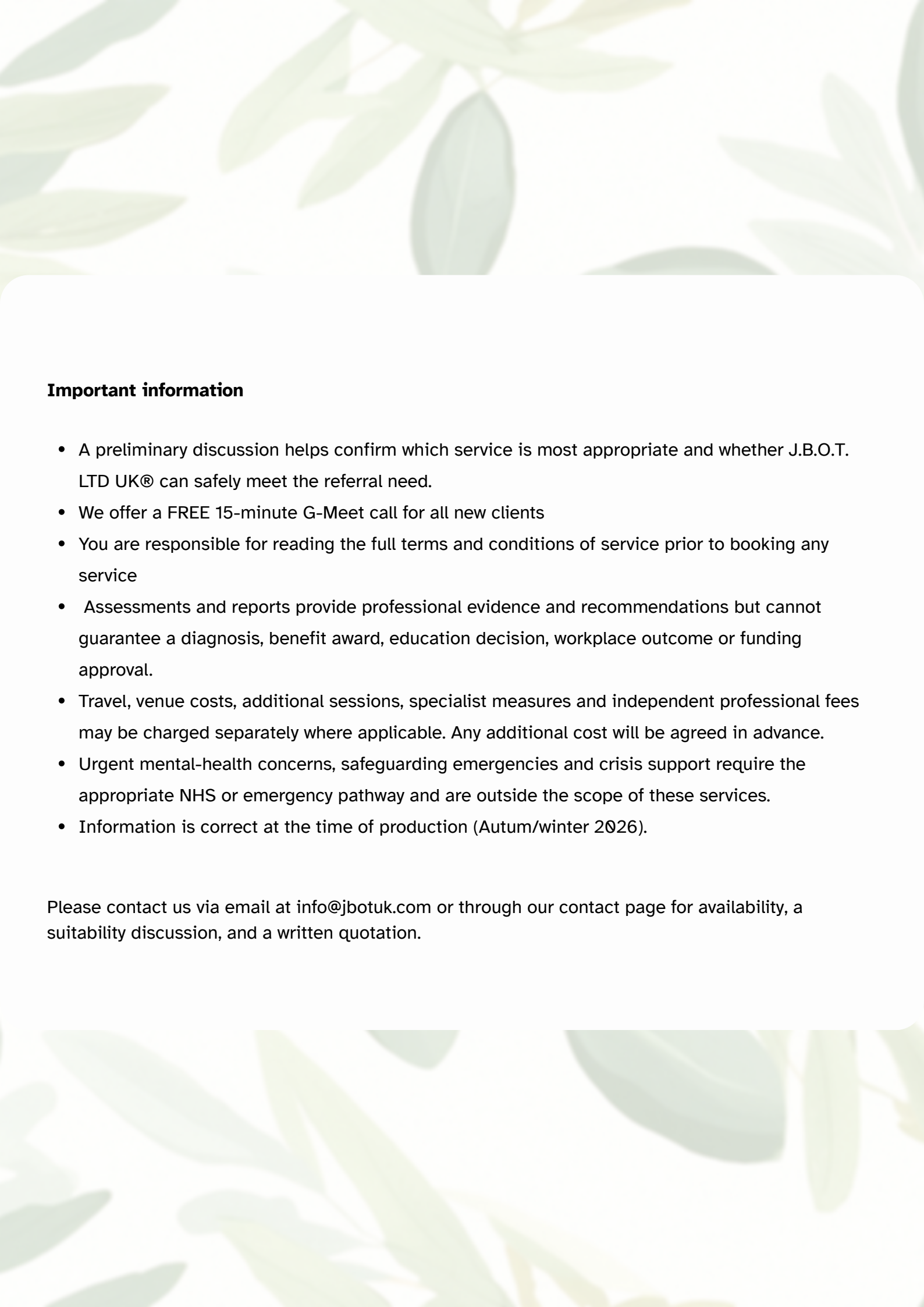
